Great Basin Classroom

Our nation's national parks create the perfect learning laboratories. That's why we are dedicated to bringing the science and wonder of Great Basin National Park to students wherever they live. Great Basin National Park Foundation education programs are designed to inspire place-based science learning while growing personal connections to the outdoors. In a time when students average only 20% proficiency on state science exams and only ten minutes outside per day, making sure children can benefit from national parks is crucial. We work with many partners to bring innovative programs to students, including the National Park Service, the University of Nevada, Reno, Southern Utah University, PBS Reno Curiosity Classroom, the Center for Interactive Learning and Collaboration (CILC), and the Great Basin Heritage Area Partnership. Students are introduced to what makes the Great Basin ecosystem unique and invited to share in its stewardship.



Native Voices

In 2024, Great Basin National Park Foundation made it possible for indigenous groups from the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation, the Ely Shoshone, the Paiute Indian Tribes of Utah, and the Noowah Knowledge Center to have meaningful overnight visits in the Park. On some of these trips, youth learned about NPS careers and helped with active research. On other trips, tribal cultural knowledge holders discussed management of Park resources with the Park's management team. The Foundation also supported important storytelling initiatives, such as a documentary on the 50-year-old tribally owned Duckwater Shoshone elementary school.

Great Basin Explorers

The Great Basin Explorers program helps connect underserved communities to Great Basin National Park through immersive camping programs. In 2024, the Foundation supported 36 participants from Las Vegas to experience the Milky Way, high altitude lakes, camping in a national park, and a wilderness experience, for the first time.

Art in the Park

Artist-in-Residence programs offer tremendous opportunities for engagement between parks, artists, and park visitors, continuing a long tradition of sharing and interpreting the landscape through artistic mediums.

The Foundation supported three AIRs in 2024 and will support three in 2025. The 2024 artists included Suze Woolf, a watercolor painter; Alina Lindquist, a plein air painter; and photographer Paul Atkinson. The 2025 artists include Meghan Dragon, a muralist and painter; Meghan and Caitlyn Baylor, twin sister dancers and choreographers; and Jack Straton, a photographer.

This spring, audiences will hear composer Marko Bazjer's world premiere at the Reno Philharmonic, which was written during his 2023 Artist-in-Residency. The March 22nd and 23rd performances of *The Sacrifice of Prometheus*, includes actual sounds of Bristlecone pine trees he gathered with electrodes while at Great Basin National Park.



Great Basin Dark Skies

Great Basin is an International Dark Sky Park and the only national park that boasts a research-grade astronomical telescope. The skies here are world-renowned for their darkness and are a major tourism draw. In 2024, Great Basin National Park showed 8,830 Park visitors the cosmos with key Great Basin National Park Foundation support. Great Basin Guardians supported two specialized interns to add scientific knowledge and staff capacity to Park astronomy programs and replaced three aging Park telescopes with new top of the line equipment. The Foundation also invested in the Great Basin Observatory's operational capacity, adding new volunteer team members and upgrading equipment. The GBO continues to be a one of its kind destination for middle school to graduate level researchers who study exoplanets, supernovae, double star systems, asteroids, and black holes.
